



August 1st - August 8th, 2015

These are, starting details regarding our annual week this summer, at the Haliburton Scout Reserve (*hereafter referred to as HSR – no relation to the Hamilton bus*). All Scouts who want to go may do so. We will be camping on our own reserved site, Doe Island (pictured below), with adult Scout Leaders in charge.

The HSR is a premiere Scouting facility in Canada. The lake (Kennabi or Kennabik) is completely enclosed within the camp, so no one but Scouts and staff have access to it.

Safety is paramount, at all times. There are emergency phones at every site, a camp doctor, stores, and many years of wisdom overseeing every aspect of the entire experience.

Or, go to www.YouTube.com and type "haliburton scout reserve" into the search box, and you'll experience what many others have, through their eyes... including but not limited to Swimming, Hiking, Bouldering Wall, Canoeing, Rowing, Fishing, Rifle, Outpost Camping, Overnights, Sailing, Kayaking, Snorkelling, Archery, Survival, Rappelling, and the list goes on.

The fee includes bus transport to and from camp. If you wish to drop off at the camp, or pick up after; please advise us. We will be happy to make this arrangement, but it will not change the Camp Fee as the bus expenses are a budget item. The bus will load at Binbrook United Church.

Departure from Binbrook, around 6am on the 1st
Returning home, at ~5pm on the 8th.

Scouts should bring a bag lunch for the trip to camp, or pocket money for Subway. A meal at a restaurant is included in the Budget for the return (homebound) trip.

Close attention should be paid to the Personal Equipment List at the back of this letter. Please advise us in a separate note of any new special information or medical requirements that Leaders should know about. Scouts should have their Health Card number on file (or in their possession), and any Meds with them.

The Camp Fee includes: Campsite Fees, Transport, Food, Crafts, and Activities. It doesn't include: Tuck (Ice Cream, candy snacks, Soft Drinks, etc), Souvenirs, or Fishing Gear/Supplies. We suggest \$15-\$30 pocket money, and a reminder of being personally responsible for your own pocket money.

Emergency Contact: I will have my cell phone on (number below), answering or taking messages (as physical actions at that time allow), and will return all calls.

In addition, digital notes/postcards and photos will escape camp, via Twitter, the same as in previous years. (we can receive too) So, you can keep an eye on us... ☺

It's an awesome week away as a patrol of Scouts. An unique experience. Please ask any questions you like, at any time, there are no stupid questions.

The Cost

The starting budget cost for the week, is \$390 per person.

(we've finally had to raise it \$10 over the last few years..)

By applying Popcorn and Toilet Paper fundraising to date, the **actual cost per person, will decrease – math to be completed after Bottle Drive next week.**

Notes on the cost:

1. The Scouts have already through their own fundraising efforts this year, lowered the cost of the camp by a big chunk, and if you so desire, we can lower it even more through fundraising. (we still have some cases of TP/PT, and have created a direct "you sell, you benefit" ratio to help that)
2. All we will ask for at this point, is a \$100 deposit, and let's see if we can raise some more together. (the bottle drive is a good example, we can usually get this down closer to \$200-275 each!)
3. If finances are a concern, please speak to me. There are funds we can apply for together, for engaged families that are on a restricted budget.
No one who desires to attend, is left behind.
We also have "angels in the wings" that we can call on.
4. The cost includes program, food, and bus transport to and from camp.
(we share cost with 333rd, and 1st Winona, and leave from Binbrook)
5. Final payment of any outstanding balance after we do the math, must be turned in by July 1st, but can be post-dated to July 25th, if that helps anyone.

Cancellation/Refund Policy

If an emergency comes up, and for some reason your youth cannot attend, a full refund, minus a \$50 fee for goods already purchased, is available up until the day before departure. We know sometimes the unthinkable happens, and we don't wish to be an additional worry during a time of personal or family crisis.

Everything clearly marked with your name or initials !!

WORN to TRAVEL:

CAMP T-SHIRT (included in camp fee and handed out at our pre-camp meeting, likely)
TROOP NECKERCHIEF and WOGGLE
A SUN-PROTECTIVE HAT (wide brim preferred, hats are mandatory)
SCOUT SHORTS OR OTHER DARK SHORTS
RUNNING SHOES
APPROPRIATE LAYERED OUTERWEAR (for the weather on the day)

CARRY IN A BACKPACK/DUFFLE BAG: (Troop can loan these if you don't have one)

SLEEPING BAG IN STUFF BAG

CANTEEN OR WATER BOTTLE

7 PAIRS SPARE SOCKS
7 SPARE UNDERWEAR AND T-SHIRTS
SPARE JEANS AND PLAY SHORTS
TRACK SUIT OR POLO PYJAMAS
WARM PULLOVER OR SWEATER

OPTIONAL:

FIRE STARTERS (for when your Patrol is Duty Patrol)
INSECT REPELLENT (CONTAINING AT LEAST 25% DEET, AND
NON-SPRAY TYPE SO IT DOESN'T DAMAGE NYLON TENTS)
FISHING GEAR (NO GANG HOOKS ON LURES - SINGLE HOOKS ONLY)
(disassemble please, and bring ready to transport)
BOOKS, Non-ELECTRONIC GAMES or Deck of cards, FOR A QUIET
MOMENT/RAINY DAY
SWIM MASK, FINS
COMPASS (only one)
CAMERA (inexpensive)

RADIOS, IPODS, ETC. ARE PERMITTED. IF THEY DISTURB OTHER CAMPERS OR THE
TRANQUILITY OF NATURE THEY WILL BE HELD BY THE LEADERS.

****EXCEPT IN EMERGENCY KITS, MATCHES ARE FOR PATROL BOXES ONLY!! ****

****Personal Candy/Snacks from home, MUST go into the patrol boxes, and will likely be
shared with others – NO FOOD IN THE TENTS, EVER! ****

WE DO NOT RECOMMEND THAT SCOUTS TAKE A CELLPHONE TO CAMP. THERE ARE NO
RECHARGING FACILITIES, AND CELLPHONES REPRESENT A SERIOUS DANGER OF
HOMESICKNESS. THERE IS A TELEPHONE AT THE CAMP GROCERY STORE, AND WE WILL HAVE
A CELLPHONE ON THE LEADERS' SITE FOR EMERGENCIES.
